Where to now?

"He remembers his covenant forever, the promise he made for a thousand generations." Psalm 105:8

There is a scene in the first Lord of the Rings movie 'The Fellowship of the Ring', where a diverse collection of characters is gathered together to seek a way of saving their very existence. It's a difficult mission that requires someone to make a dangerous journey to perform a difficult task on behalf of them, although no one can agree on who should do it or how this will be achieved. The conversation quickly erupts into bickering and arguing. In the midst of the chaos, the voice of a small, insignificant, unassuming character by the name of Frodo, pierces the ears of all those present, 'I'll do it, though, I do not know the way.'

Frodo is not a leader, he's not a warrior, an explorer or strategist. He's a simple famer in a small village. Frodo is a willing participant. His willingness inspired others to join him on a quest to being a fellowship working towards a common goal.

Whether we are part of the activities of our local church or the broader activities of the Conference of Churches of Christ, there are times of difficulty being in fellowship with one another, not being able to agree on a way forward to engage God's mission and sometimes finding willing participants to commit to the task together.

I draw my hope from the Psalm our Conference President, Grant Spangenberg, has presented to lead us into the next Convention this November. God's promise before us is an eternal promise that stretches far beyond our generation and the generations to come. God has a mission that creates a church as it moves forward and continues to be revealed to us. God's mission calls us to tune in and see what God is up to, to fellowship together in partnership with God and discover together, the adventure God is taking us on as He continues to build the church in our midst.

"Give praise to the Lord, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done. Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of his wonderful acts." Psalm 105:1-2

We have a mission that has been made clear to us – to proclaim the name of our Lord Jesus Christ – his life, death and resurrection. This is the heartbeat of the Good News that has brought us together as a fellowship, a conference of churches. This is our common cause. The activity of God we experience in our churches and discern in our neighbourhoods is what we continue to celebrate together.

So how do we get there?

'Forward in Faith' is not just a nice theme for our next Convention, it's our response to God's promise. We know God is doing something among us that we cannot do for ourselves. We have been discerning how we move forward in faith through serving, learning and discipling. It's a classic action reflection model of discerning, participating, learning and reflecting on God's mission together. We re-enter the serving, learning and discipling loop with fresh understanding of how God is forming us to participate in the mission most effectively - but first it requires us to be willing participants.

I have been deeply privileged to be able to spearhead a leadership development strategy forming ministers for Churches of Christ. It's a strategy based on the promise that God is ahead of us and is helping us build the infrastructure for the future that awaits us. This strategy is called the Tabor Churches of Christ Study Centre.

I've been the director of the centre since January 2016. Not only do I teach a range of subjects from Churches of Christ identity to leadership development, but I have been spending time working with the supervised ministry field education program. Before I started we rarely had churches hosting student ministers. This semester we have 9 Churches of Christ congregations hosting student ministers. This includes 9 of our ministers supervising field placements and at least another 4

of our ministers working alongside students as formation supervisors. This is just one example of the great celebration of pressing into the strategy God's lays on our hearts as we continue to move towards God's great mission.

God has given us the tools we need: prayer, faith, the Holy Spirit and one another. God calls us to join a mission that has been promised for many

generations to come. Where to now? That's up to each one of us.
